Aiming Is Not The Problem!

Most school players aim straighter than they think. Almost every player that has been playing a few years aims straight enough to make most shots. **So here's the secret.**

The good players are just better at moving the stick perfectly straight through the cue ball and keeping their head perfectly still as they are shooting.

You can test this yourself by placing the cue ball on the spot and shooting different shots. Have someone watch you and see if your head moves at all while stroking through the cue ball. And you can check when you're finished to see if the stick is perfectly straight, 4 to 6 inches across the spot.

Do this exercise every month or two to make sure your stroke is straight and your head does not move.



Recreational Division Singles:

Patsy Gallant from Ville-Marie came into the tournament on fire, winning every one of her matches. She eventually met Albina Lavictoire from North Bay, who was also undefeated - meaning one of these ladies would have to lose twice to determine the true 1st place champion. After an incredible run, Patsy captured her very first Rumble title, marking a huge milestone in her competitive journey.

Copper # 2 Division Singles:

Owen Lajambe of Sudbury (New Crown) came out firing, opening his day with a strong win over Xavier Barrette from Ville-Marie. From that moment on, Owen never looked back. He stayed focused, played smart, and delivered clutch shots all the way through the bracket. With impressive consistency and calm under pressure, Owen powered his way through the field and earned a huge milestone – his first ever Rumble championship win! A fantastic performance and a well deserved title!

Copper # 1 Division Singles:

Arjay Brisson of North Bay showed what true determination looks like. After taking an early loss in Singles, he was forced onto the long road of the B-side where every match is a battle and every mistake can end your run. But Arjay didn't back down. He fought his way through opponent after opponent, staying focused, steady, and confident as he climbed his way back into contention. With each win he gained momentum, turning what started as a setback into an incredible comeback story.

By the end of the day, Arjay's resilience paid off in the best way possible - his first ever 1st place Rumble title! A well deserved win and an amazing run from start to finish.

Bronze # 2 Division Singles:

Open Division Singles:

Copper Division:

In this 29 Team Division, the finals came down to two outstanding teams. From North Bay, Shaft'em - featuring Greg Gilson, Ralph Loggie, Rob Guillemette and Tim Derosier - powered their way through the

bracket and secured their place in the championship match. Facing them was Les Borderline from Ville-Marie, with Réal Rivard, Dany Cousineau, Franic Brisson and Serge Royer, who also battled through their round-robin bracket with three strong wins to earn their spot in the finals. What followed was an incredibly tight and exciting showdown. Bronze Division:








The Doctor's In...


Tom "Dr. Cue" Rossman

The Doctor has been entertaining VNEA players for over 30 years and is one of the most knowledgeable instructors in the business. Tom is also known for his amazing trick shot artistry and hilarious shows around the country.



Back in 1974 I started promoting Artistic Pool ("trick shots and so much more") entertainment shows worldwide, while demonstrating the "twists & turns"/"dips & dives" of pocket billiards in a humorous and contagious "Dr. Cue" Table Trotter style!

The foundational concept of this special "art" is based on the Harlem Globetrotters and how they have performed thousands of times playing an entertaining form of basketball, seemingly missing over half of their shots, while doing humorous accents in action and word as professional "cover lines", so to speak. A few of these are: shooting a "free throw" with a basketball that just happens to be attached to a string – only to have the ball come right back from midflight to the shooter's hand, plus running toward the fans in the stands with a perceived "bucket of water" – only to have the thrown contents discovered as "confetti" – for a hilarious part of the show. Numerous dribbling and passing routines at the beginning of their performance, all to the fan-friendly music of Sweet Georgia Brown, creates a smooth-flowing attraction to magnetize the attention of the audience.







Cueisms" (cover lines that are mostly humorous) are used as needed on hundreds of shots to entertain, teach, and/ or keep the show rolling right along. The overall genre / gift of "Table Trotter Art" has etched its mark in the billiard industry and beyond now for over 50 years. As a side note, the Harlem Globetrotters are still going strong after 100 years of their unique form of basketball entertainment and presentation of special sport skills.

Recently "Dr. Cue" was invited to a special event called the Table Trotter Nation Annual Gathering / Blind Draw Doubles Pool Tournament in Lee's Summit, Missouri. This special gathering of "Table Trotters" is primarily centered on normal pool shooting in a competitive situation. Charlie Maize has organized this event and spearheaded the overall Table Trotter Team concept for many years now. He has invited "Dr. Cue" to demonstrate his original and on-going Table Trotter entertainment gifts and talents during the event, plus has encouraged him to play in the Doubles Pool Tournament, which is one more opportunity to "Play Skillfully With A Shout Of Joy" (Psalm 33:3).

If you have not already done so, I hope each of you may see the Harlem Globetrotters one day, plus you may experience some special table time with a Table Trotter (in competition) and / or enjoy the Table Trotter antics of "Dr. Cue" until next time (and beyond) when...

Team Format

Teams will consist of three playing members who have competed in at least 6 junior league matches with the same Charter Holder. The 9 game round robin format will be used in the 8-ball team events. Each player will play each player from the opposing team once. The team with the most points at the end of the match will be declared the winner.

All divisions will be of the double elimination format with the finals bracket participants starting with zero losses subject to change based on entries.

The Sports & Redemption Divisions will be Single Elimination.

Tie Breaker

If there is a tie in the Total Points at the end of the match, proceed as follows until a winner is decided...

- Play last round again, with the same match-ups, on the scoresheet/computer.
- Each Team will begin with zero points.
- Flip for first break and alternate thereafter.

Singles Format

Race - 4 games/winners and losers

The Sports & Redemption Divisions will be Single Elimination subject to change based on entries.

All players must have competed in a minimum of 6 junior league matches. The double elimination format will be used.

Substitution Rule

A team may substitute players during a match if the following criteria are met:

- The opposing team captain must be notified before the start of the round in which the substitution is being made.
- A substitute player will not be allowed to play any opposing player more than once.
- Once a player has played, he/she must keep that same position unless removed for a round and reinstated in a later round.

Determining the Break

Team: Team captains will flip a coin prior to making the line-up. The winner of the coin toss has a chance of being home or visiting team. The home team will complete their line-up first each round. The teams will then break in accordance with the scoresheet.

Singles: Flip a coin to determine the first break and alternate thereafter.

Official Scoresheet

The Home Scoresheet is the official scoresheet and will be used to settle any disputes. Both captains are responsible for the accuracy of the Home scoresheet after each game.

8-On-The-Break

If the 8-ball is pocketed on the break, the breaker may ask for a rerack or have the 8-ball spotted and continue shooting. If the breaker scratches while pocketing the 8-ball on the break, the opposing player has the option of a rerack or having the 8-ball spotted before beginning to shoot.

Rack Your Own Breaks

- Various Rack Devices will NOT be allowed.

Devices Are Not Allowed For Jump Shots

Call Pocket

In Call Pocket, obvious balls and pockets do not have to be indicated. It is the opponent's right to ask which ball and pocket if he/she is unsure of the shot. Banks and combinations are not considered obvious and both the object ball and the pocket must be called. When calling the shot, it is NEVER necessary to indicate details such as the number of cushions, banks, kisses, caroms, etc. Any balls pocketed on a foul remain pocketed, regardless of whether they belong to the shooter or the opponent. If a shooter continually refuses to inform his opponent, even when asked, the captains or tournament officials should be informed. Continuous failure to verbally call the pocket can be ruled unsportsmanlike conduct.

Team Roster

The "Official Team Roster" are the players listed on the Scoresheet/Computer.

Illegal Team Player

Any Team determined to have listed a Team Member on the Tournament Scoresheet, for any match that has begun, that is not listed on the "Official Team Roster" will be penalized as follows...

- The Team will Forfeit any match in progress or any match completed before their next round begins and eliminated from any further Team competition.
- The Team will Forfeit any Prizes.

Safeties

A Safety can be played within the definition of a legal shot.

Start of Match

All matches will start at their posted time if the assigned table is available. If a player/players is absent, the match must still begin and the absent player/players will have until the end of that round to show up. If they are not there by the end of the round, the absent person/persons will lose that game 10-0. This rule is the same for all the rounds.

Played Wrong Player

In the event that wrong people have played or are playing each other, the following procedure will be followed:

- If the game is completed, that score will be forwarded to the proper place that they are scheduled to play. That score will not count until it falls into the proper place.
- If the game is not completed, the captains will get the proper people to the table and restart the game.
- If a game is played between the same opponents for a second time during the match, the score of the second time does not count as long as the scoresheet is filled out properly prior to the round beginning.
- It is both team captain's responsibility to ensure that the proper players are playing each game before the round starts. Therefore, if one captain listed a player to play the same player a second time, the captains team who listed the wrong player will lose 10-0.

End of Match

A match is considered over when a team can no longer mathematically win.

Forfeits

Team & Singles...

Be sure to read and be aware of the Forfeit Procedures that are posted in the Tournament Room.

Scoring

If a game ends without a group of balls being legally determined, the winner receives ten points and the opponent receives zero points.

Junior League players who have played in the VNEA World Championships in Las Vegas will not be eligible to compete in the 36th Annual International Junior Pool Championships.

Tournament Referees will be used and decisions will be final.



DRESS CODE

All participants in the Int'l Junior Championships must comply with the following Dress Code:

- 1. No Halter Tops No Cut-Offs No Swimwear No Midriffs No Tank Tops No Tube Tops No Improper Verbiage No Droopy Pants
- 2. All shorts must be clean, neat, presentable, hemmed and of proper length to be allowed. Rugged cut-offs will not be allowed.
- 3. All players, during their scheduled matches, will present themselves in a neat and clean appearance.
- 4. Tournament officials will have the right to ask any player or spectator not properly attired to leave the playing area.
- 5. Absolutely no alcoholic beverages or smoking in the Tournament Room.
- 6. Ear buds are not allowed during a match.







What's Your Call?

Veteran VNEA Referee, **Fred Johnson**, creatively explains many common questions that frequently arise during VNEA League play. Fred is also a long-time working referee at our World Championships.



NEW RULE - THE 8-BALL MARKER IS GONE!

Snooker and Carom are playing 8-Ball. Snooker has run the table and is on the 8-Ball with a straight-in shot into the corner pocket. Snooker simply leans over the table shoots the 8-Ball into the obvious pocket without marking the pocket for the 8-Ball. Carom leaps to her paws and declares a foul and loss of game. Snooker does not acknowledge a foul and does not acknowledge that he has lost the game. Quite the contrary, Snooker claims that he has won, and under the new Rule, he doesn't have to mark the pocket for the 8-Ball. You are called to the table as the Referee to decide the issue. **You Make The Call!**

Effective July 1, 2025, the Rule requiring the marking/patching of the pocket for the 8-Ball has been eliminated. The original Rule which was in the 3rd paragraph of Rule D. GAME has been modified as follows:

"When a player has pocketed all of the balls in his group, he then shoots at the 8-ball."

Snooker says that marking/patching the pocket for the 8-Ball has gone away, and that there isn't any requirement to mark the pocket. Carom says that you always have to mark the pocket for the 8-Ball. **Who is correct?**

The VNEA has "Call Pocket" which is found in the 1st paragraph of Rule D. GAME. In "Call Pocket", obvious balls and pockets do not have to be indicated. So **IF** it is an **OBVIOUS SHOT**, then a player does not have to mark the pocket for the 8-Ball. Therefore, here, Snooker has won the game.

However, if the shot **IS NOT OBVIOUS**, then the pocket must be called. If the shot is not obvious, (and note that the Rule specifically says Banks and Combinations are not considered obvious), the pocket must be called, or it will be a loss of game. Here, if Snooker was banking the 8-Ball across to the side pocket, and Snooker did not call the pocket, Snooker would have lost the game. The opponent still has the right to ask which pocket if he is unsure of the shot.

General Tournament Information

All participants in World's Competition:

- a. Must be deemed an active player by his/her Charter Holder.
- b. Must be able to show a pictured I.D. for positive identification and prize money disbursements.
- c. Are subject to random I.D. checks for eligibility purposes.
- d. All players must have a Qualifying CSR (12 separate days of league play) at the time of Tournament registration. If a USA or Canadian player does not have a CSR, they will be placed in the **National Level** unless "known ability" places them higher.

There will be absolutely no tournament entries accepted at Tournament Site.

Exception: Mini-Tournaments & Mixed Scotch Doubles.

Players may be listed on more than one teams roster, for precautionary purposes. However, the first team that any player shoots for, is the only team that player is allowed to play for.

Tournament Dress Code

All participants in the World Championships must comply with the following Dress Code:

No Midriffs • No Cut-Offs • No Swimwear • No Tube Tops No Tank Tops • No Improper Verbiage • No Droopy Pants

All shorts must be clean, neat, presentable, hemmed and of proper length to be allowed. Rugged cut-offs will not be allowed.

All players, during their scheduled matches, will present themselves in a neat and clean appearance.

Tournament Officials will have the right to ask any player not properly attired to leave the playing area.

Be sure to dress appropriately to avoid delays, disqualifications or forfeited games during your Singles and/or Team matches.

Age Requirement

All players must be of legal drinking age to play in the licensed establishment where the qualifying league is played **AND** are at least 18 years of age.

All prize money winners must be 21 years old to cash their winnings at the Westgate Casino Cage.

NEW...

CSR Rating System: What Is It?

- The CSR system assigns a numerical rating to players based on their performance in league and tournament matches that use the CompuSport software.
- The rating is between 1000 (Beginner) and 2200. (Professional)
- Each CSR has an accuracy of the rating (Between 1 and 5 stars, the higher the better)

How Is A New Player Rated?

- When a player starts, their CSR is calculated using the CSR of their opponents combined with their performance in those matches. As they continue to play, their CSR adjusts automatically to reflect their ongoing results, becoming more accurate over time.
- Each week, a formula is used on each game result to determine points to add or remove to each player's CSR. The formula uses the accuracy of each rating, the odds to win, and the results of the game. (Win or lose, flawless game)
- For each game, the current rating (and accuracy) of each player is used to determine the odds of winning. The higher your odds of winning, the less impact the win will have on the rating.
- To prevent manipulation, the CSR rating calculation is done so it cannot move rapidly over a few weeks. This means a player can't lose a bunch of games before a tournament to make the CSR lower.

Non-International & Canadian Players without a Qualified CSR...

- Women: will be assigned a 1651 CSR and will play in the National Level Singles
- Men: will be assigned an 1801 CSR and will play in the National Level Singles
- Classic/Senior Women: will be assigned a 1625 CSR and will play in the Entertainment Level Singles
- Classic/Senior Men: will be assigned a 1775 CSR and will play in the Entertainment Level Singles (Known Ability could place players in a Higher Level (Tournament Committee Discretion)

International Players...

- All players must have a Qualified CSR.

Frozen CSR...

- All players CSR will be FROZEN as of April 14th to determine what Level they will participate in.
- 12 weeks of play must be completed by date of Frozen CSR to know what Level to enter at Registration Date.

Qualified CSR...

- Players must play a minimum of 12 separate league days to establish a Qualified CSR.

CHANGES...

Open & Women's Teams must be comprised of players from within their Charter Holder's League System (same C-H #). **Original league team players are no longer required.** You may now play with anyone within your Charter Holder's League System, however, your Team CSR Total will determine which Level you will participate in.

Classic / Senior Ages: Classic Women - 50; Classic Men - 55; Senior Men/Women: 65 (All ages are determined as of date of event start)

TOURNAMENT REMINDERS, CHANGES & NEW!

PLAYER/TEAM ADDITIONS & CHANGES:

"PRIOR" TO MAY 1ST, 2026...

Player Changes and/or Team Member Changes must be e-mailed to **info@vnea.com** and must include accurate player stats showing at least (12) separate league days of play. These new updates will be reviewed and the player/team will be placed in the proper skill level.

"AFTER" MAY 1ST, 2026...

Any Additions or Changes after May 1st will include a \$25 Late Fee for each event.

Player Changes and/or Team Member Changes must be e-mailed to **info@vnea.com** and must include accurate player stats showing at least (12) separate league days of play.

Team Player changes must be rated equal to or less than the players they are replacing. If teams list more than (5) Open and (4) Women, the highest 5 or 4 players CSR's will be used to determine Level placement and will not change with player changes. Changes will not lower or raise the Level the Team entered in.

VNEA Headquarters will determine when they will no longer accept additions or changes. However, last minute Singles and Team changes may be made by the Charter Holder in Las Vegas at the posted dates and times, if applicable.

In addition to meeting VNEA's standard eligibility requirements, players must also comply with the following:

- All players must be entered with their highest known CSR at the time of Registration
 Frozen Date: This is the responsibility of the Charter Holder and any duplicate Profiles must be
 merged in order for the entry to be accepted. Accuracy of player abilities are dependent upon the proper
 submission and documentation from the Charter Holder.
- 2. Player ability assessment may be determined by the Tournament Committee by any of the following criteria:
 - a. Player Skill Rating (CSR)
 - b. Review of previous VNEA Tournament performances both locally and at World's.
 - c. Examination of overall Local League Ratings.
 - d. Known Ability

All decisions made by the Tournament Committee are final.

True 2nd Chance Events: (Sports & Redemption) With all players entering a Level with their Qualified CSR, the abilities should be comparable. Therefore, as the 2nd Chance events are created, they will be a true test of equitable Teams competing for cash, titles and prizes.

Charter Holders Read Carefully

The VNEA offers numerous **LEVELS** at the World Championships in Las Vegas so all of your league players have the option of participating and competing at the annual extravaganza.

The VNEA takes very seriously the entrants in each LEVEL by implementing computer audits to detect individuals that are incorrectly entered.

However, due to name changes, incorrect spellings, human error and other factors the system is not always 100% fool proof.

Therefore, the Tournament Committee is hereby notifying all Charter Holders that the VNEA will still strongly monitor all entrants but it is the ultimate responsibility of the Charter Holder, prior to submitting entries, to be sure all of their players are entered into the proper LEVELS.

Charter Holders found to have entered players in improper LEVELS will be punished in accordance with the World Championships Policies & Procedures.

Thank you very much for your cooperation in this matter so that we will continue to provide the fairest, most equitable, competitive annual event for our sanctioned league players.

We are conducting the "13th Annual VNEA World Team Championship" this year during our VNEA Championships.

This exciting event will match "top players" from every country represented at our tournament.

Teams will compete against each other in a 1-Day "Battle Royale"! The winning country will claim the coveted World Cup and NEW Championship Belt and be proclaimed VNEA WORLD CHAMPIONS for the entire year!

Each team will consist of (4) players from their home country and it will be a single-elimination format.

Make your plans to be in **"THE OMEGA"** Finals Arena (Monday, May 25th) to support your country in this "fan-friendly" and "fun-filled" event.

Vegas Rules, Format, etc.

Team Format

The 25 game round robin format will be used in the Open 8-Ball team events. The 16 game round robin format will be used in the Women's 8-Ball team events. Each player will play each player from the opposing team once. The team with the most points at the end of the match will be declared the winner.

- All National, Entertainment & Amateur Level Team events will be played using a Double Elimination format in the qualifying brackets. Finals brackets will be re-drawn with participants starting with no losses and will also be Double Elimination.
- The Sports Division will be Double Elimination and will consist of 5-Person Open Teams (25 Game Format) and 4-Person Women's Teams (16 Game Format).
- The Redemption Division will be Single Elimination and will consist of 4-Person Open Teams (16 Game Format) and 3-Person Women's Teams (9 Game Format).
- For Sports & Redemption Teams, all players MUST be listed on the **Original "Official Team Roster"**.
- Valley Level Team events will be using the **Triple** Elimination format. The Finals will be **Double Elimination.**

Tie Breaker

If there is a tie in the Total Points at the end of the match, proceed as follows until a winner is decided...

- Play last round again, with the same match-ups, on the scoresheet.
- · Each Team will begin with zero points.
- Flip for first break and alternate thereafter.

Singles Format

(exception: Redemption Divisions)

All Singles events will be played using a Double Elimination format in the qualifying brackets. Finals brackets will be redrawn with participants starting with no losses and will also be Double Elimination. See pg. 54 for all Levels Races.

Substitution Rule

A team may substitute players during a match if the following criteria are met:

The opposing team captain must be notified before the start of the round in which the substitution is being made.

A substitute player will not be allowed to play any opposing player more than once.

Once a player has played, he/she must keep that same position unless removed for a round and reinstated in a later round.

Determining the Break

Teams...

Team captains will flip a coin prior to making the line-up. The winner of the coin toss has a choice of being home or visiting team. The home team will complete their line-up first each round. The teams will then break in accordance with the scoresheet.

Singles...

Flip a coin to determine the first break and alternate thereafter.

Table Use

Teams will play on two tables at all times, until the 25th game (25 game format) or 16th game (16 game format). It will be the Tournament Director's discretion to play matches on more than 2 tables if time is a factor

Official Scoresheet

The Home Scoresheet is the official scoresheet and will be used to settle any disputes. Both captains are responsible for the accuracy of the Home scoresheet after each game.

Devices Are Not Allowed For Jump Shots

8-On the Break

If the 8-Ball is pocketed on the break, the breaker may ask for a re-rack or have the 8-Ball spotted and continue shooting. If the breaker scratches while pocketing the 8-Ball on the break, the opposing player has the option of a re-rack or having the 8-Ball spotted before beginning to shoot.

Rack Your Own Breaks

(Various Rack Devices will NOT be allowed)

Call Pocket

In Call Pocket, obvious balls and pockets do not have to be indicated. It is the opponent's right to ask which ball and pocket if he is unsure of the shot. Banks and combinations are not considered obvious and both the object ball and pocket must be called. When calling the shot, it is NEVER necessary to indicate details such as the number of cushions, banks, kisses, caroms, etc. Any balls pocketed on a foul remain pocketed, regardless of whether they belong to the shooter or the opponent. If a shooter continually refuses to inform his opponent, even when asked, the captains or tournament officials should be informed. Continuous failure to verbally call the pocket can be ruled unsportsmanlike conduct.

Team Roster

The "Official Team Roster" are the players listed on the scoresheet/computer.

Illegal Team Player

Any Team determined to have listed a Team Member on the Tournament Scoresheet, for any match that has begun, that is not listed on the "Official Team Roster" will be penalized as follows

- The Team will Forfeit any match in progress or any match completed before their next round begins and eliminated from any further Team competition.
- The Team will Forfeit any Prize Money.

Safeties

A Safety can be played within the definition of a legal shot.

Start of Match

All matches will start at their posted time if the assigned table is available.

Once at the table, please scan the QR Code on the table to alert your opponent that you are at the table and ready to start the match.

If a player/players is absent, the match must still begin and the absent player/players will have until the end of that round to show up. If they are not there by the end of the round, the absent person/persons will lose that game 10-0. This rule is the same for all the rounds.

Played Wrong Player

In the event that wrong people have played or are playing each other, the following procedure will be followed:

- If the game is completed, that score will be forwarded to the proper place that they are scheduled to play. That score will not count until it falls into the proper place.
- If the game is not completed, the captains will get the proper people to the table and restart the game.
- If a game is played between the same opponents for a second time during the match, the score of the second time does not count as long as the scoresheet is filled out properly prior to the round beginning.

The governing rules of play are detailed in the 2025-2026 VNEA Rules Booklet and will be strictly adhered to along with the following:

It is both team captain's responsibility to ensure that the proper players are playing each game before the round starts. Therefore, if one captain listed a player to play the same player a second time, the captains team who listed the wrong player will lose 10-0.

End of Match

A match is considered over when a team can no longer mathematically win.

Forfeits

Team... All Teams must be at their assigned tables at their assigned match time. If a Team is not at their assigned tables **5 minutes** after their posted start time, the opposing Team will call a referee to the table and the missing Team will be notified via CompuSport App and will have **10 minutes** to show up at the table. At the end of **10 minutes**, the Team who is present will recall the referee and the *match will be forfeited* if the missing Team is not present. In the event that enough team members, but less than the full team, are available when the match is called, then those present must begin shooting. If the table is not available, you must report to the control desk.

Singles... All players must be at their assigned table at their assigned match time. If a player is not at their assigned table 5 minutes after their posted start time, the opponent will call a referee to the table and the missing player will be notified via CompuSport App and will have 10 minutes to show up at the table. At the end of 10 minutes, the player who is present will recall the referee and the match will be forfeited if the missing player is not present. If the table is not available, you must report to the control desk.

Protest Procedure

In the event a person or team wishes to protest a player's or a team's eligibility, the protesting team or person will be required to deposit \$100 with tournament officials. If protesters are correct in their protest, they will be refunded their deposit and the tournament officials will take proper measures in dealing with the situation. If protesters are incorrect in their protest, they will forfeit their deposit. Deposits will go into the general funds of the VNEA.

Classics & Seniors

2026 VNEA All-Star Information

All individuals participating at this years Vegas Championships are eligible to earn points towards selection to the VNEA All-Star Team.

The Tournament will be broken down into four categories:

8-Ball Singles, 9-Ball Singles, Mixed Scotch Doubles & Team

The Tournament Committee will be selecting the elite few to be called "All-Stars" from all of the participants based on a performance criteria.

Those individuals accumulating the most points during the course of the Tournament Week will be selected to either the 1st Team, 2nd Team or as Honorable Mention.

The 1st & 2nd Team All-Stars will receive **Onboard Sportswear**. All players chosen, including those earning an Honorable Mention, will be presented a well deserved **Official All-Star Team Certificate**.
